Your impact:

You'll be part of a dynamic team driving real change for animals across England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland. You'll be able to make a tangible difference, influence policy and be at the forefront of the fight against animal cruelty.

As a trustee, you'll have a shared responsibility with 6-10 fellow board members to play a pivotal role in shaping our strategic direction and overseeing our mission to protect animals from the horrific acts of hunting, shooting and animal fighting.

Responsibilities:

- Read and digest complex information via board papers
- Participate in the Annual General Meeting, one in-person board meeting and three virtual board meetings per year, plus interim communications as required
 - o Time commitment approx. four days per month
- To ensure the financial stability of the League as a charity today and for the future, analysing financial reports and ensuring budgets are invested in line with the charity's aims and objects.
- Identify and assess potential risks to the organisation and work with the leadership team to implement effective risk management strategies to protect the charity's assets and reputation
- Collaboratively problem solve, addressing challenges, leveraging diverse perspectives, and making
 informed decisions to uphold the charity's mission and values.

We campaign for change

Standing up for those who don't have a voice, our hard-hitting campaigns inspire action and demand changes to legislation to protect them.

Our high-profile work in the media and expert behind thescenes lobbying across the devolved nations, ensures we can create awareness of the plight our wildlife faces.

We provide intelligence to law enforcement

Our animal crimewatch gathers reports of suspected animal cruelty for us to investigate. Our in-house intelligence team provides packages for local law enforcement about those suspected of illegal activity to bring them to justice.

We safeguard the natural environment across our wildlife reserves

Our ten wildlife reserves provide a safe haven for animals to roam free from persecution. Our reserves allow space for wildlife to flourish with minimal intervention and after just a few years this has already seen positive environmental results.
