- **Finance & Compliance:** Oversee the financial health of the charity, ensuring balanced budgets, income growth and effective use of assets. Ensure all statutory and legal obligations are met, including compliance with Charity Commission, FSA, and employment regulations.
- **Stakeholder Engagement:** Cultivate relationships with key stakeholders, including politicians, donors, celebrities, trustees and staff. Build unity and trust across the charity.
- **Public Representation:** Act as the public face of the charity, representing it in the media and at public events. Confidently speak on animal welfare issues to raise awareness and support.

We educate


Our high-profile work in the media and expert behind thescenes lobbying across the devolved nations, ensures we can create awareness of the plight our wildlife faces.

Our ten wildlife reserves provide a safe haven for animals to roam free from persecution. Our reserves allow space for wildlife to flourish with minimal intervention and after just a few years this has already seen positive environmental results.
